With 6000 PC users in the Fribourg School System in Switzerland, there is a need to provide personal storage for faculty and students in a way that is easy for the IT group to manage. After evaluating FTP clients, and the native Windows WebDAV client, the Fribourg School System chose WebDrive.

"WebDrive is working out very nicely. It's easy to configure and I've had a lot of positive reports." Says Gary Wooden, Infrastructure Manager for the school system. Teachers can use it to store and access lesson plans, test and exercises. Because of the WebDAV technology, teachers may even collaborate on a set of documents.

The school system started out by using it only for the WebDAV functionality. But because it is so easy to use, they are now beginning to use it in place of their current FTP client for uploading and modifying web sites through FTP.

The initial implementation in the Fribourg High School is expected to expand into the middle and grade schools early in 2004.

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
